Message from the Dean



As the Anne and Elmer Lindseth Dean of the Johnson School, I'm delighted to report that we have had a terrific year. We've made great progress in several areas, further strengthening the qualities that make the Johnson School unique.

Faculty and staff. Over the past year we have added many new faculty and staff members, building our capability in many academic areas and key staff positions. Several of our current faculty won major awards for their research and teaching. Overall, I am very proud of our faculty and staff, and we will continue to improve.

Executive MBA programs. We began our first Executive MBA program in 1999 with 32 students. This summer, based on a record number of applications, we welcomed 66 outstanding students to our New York City area program and 105 outstanding students to our Cornell-Queen's Executive MBA Program, offered in partnership with Queen's University in Canada. These programs help us to reach senior executives working in many businesses across North America.

Resident students' "3 Cs"

Curriculum. Hiring new faculty members enabled us to offer 15 new elective courses. In a very successful, inaugural capstone event, the "Personal Success Program," we offered graduating students an opportunity to network with our school's Advisory Council and to prepare for their careers as leaders.

Community. A strong community is a hallmark of the Johnson School. To maintain and build this community, we initiated "Sage Socials" every Thursday during the semester and built on traditions at the school. Many current students met with over 400 alumni, families, and friends during Reunion 2008.

Careers. We want to ensure that each of our students gets the employment offer that is right for them. This year, we created new positions in the Career Management Center for industry experts in marketing, finance, and consulting. In June, we gave newly admitted students a head start on their career research by offering career panels in these three areas. This spring, I wrote to alumni asking for assistance, and we received over 100 job leads for our students. In addition, staff made calls soliciting job postings and interviews with many new companies.

Looking ahead. In the coming year, we will continue to modify the curriculum in all programs and to hire outstanding new faculty and staff. We are building more capability in our Center for Global Sustainable Enterprise and Entrepreneurship@Johnson (both closely connected with related efforts across Cornell University), in global business, and in our Parker Center for Investment Research. We have several high-profile speakers already lined up for 2008-09, including Sprint Nextel CEO Daniel Hesse, MBA '77, Deloitte CEO Barry Salzberg, and Johnson & Johnson CEO Bill Weldon.

This spring, I began gathering ideas from alumni, faculty, staff, students, and corporate partners to look at ways in which we'll build and change as we form our new strategic plan.

Exciting events and changes are under way—stay tuned, and stay in touch!

Faculty Support: Reaping the rewards of MBA enthusiasm



Robert Andolina, MBA '86, spent 19 years in the equities business with Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette and then Lehman Brothers, living in New York City, San Francisco, Los Angeles, London, and Frankfurt. But when he retired in 2005, he and his family decided to settle in Ithaca, NY, largely because of its unique attractions and what Cornell brings to the community.

"You look at the university with

all its depth, the vibrant business community stemming from commercialization of the university's research, the beauty of the area—there's surely something interesting to get involved in, and for me it happened to be teaching," says Andolina.

He sees his position as a visiting senior lecturer of finance as a logical extension of his career. Andolina teaches a practicum called Capital Markets and Asset Management, drawing on his own experience and that of guest speakers to paint a broad picture of Wall Street and the asset management industry. He's impressed with the school's dedication to providing a high-quality education.

"In the business world, we all try to get things right with profit as our motive," says Andolina. "These people—the faculty, the administration, the advisory council—bring an enormous amount of personal commitment to the table with the noble motive of delivering the highest-quality educational experience possible. The gravity they place on that goal, the way they work together, and the energy they bring to the process, is really refreshing."



Eight years ago **Melissa Thomas-Hunt** was happily ensconced on the faculty at Washington University when Elizabeth "Beta" Mannix, whom she got to know as a PhD candidate at Northwestern's Kellogg School, contacted her. Mannix had just started teaching at the Johnson School and loved it, and she urged Thomas-Hunt to consider coming to Cornell.

"I came out and gave a talk, and realized that if they extended an offer to me, I couldn't imagine saying no," Thomas-Hunt says. "It was an ideal mix of colleagues who appreciated behavioral work, who could comment on my work, and who I could collaborate with, and I had heard wonderful things about the MBA students."

An associate professor of management and organizations, one of Thomas-Hunt's research interests is the contribution of expertise in diverse groups, such as project teams. Individuals are typically hired because they have knowledge or skills that the organization needs to leverage, she says, but team members may make false assumptions about their abilities based on characteristics that signal their status within the organization or society.

"Consequently, when an individual tries to contribute useful information it may not get picked up and integrated by the team, and that has a detrimental impact on performance," Thomas-Hunt explains. "I try to understand systematically what characteristics get in the way, and what organizations can do to maximize their use of knowledge that members have."

Thomas-Hunt loves the enthusiasm of Johnson School MBAs. "They are bright, engaging; they want to make a contribution. They come not only with a wish to become better managers and leaders, but to really engage with the entire community."



As a student at the Johnson School, **Gideon Saar**, PhD '00, fell in love with Cornell and the surrounding community. So when he was invited to come back to Ithaca to teach, Saar was happy to accept.

"The Johnson School has a unique environment," he says. "You have top researchers, excellent students, and a beautiful setting, which I love.

For me, that's a winning combination."

Saar, an associate professor of finance, is interested in market microstructure and behavioral finance. "One of the key characteristics of market microstructure research is that we recognize that the actions of each investor are the building blocks that create everything we observe: prices, how stocks evolve, how much volatility there is, liquidity in the market, informational efficiency—everything," he says. "My interest in behavioral finance stems from a similar belief—that there are patterns in prices and trading that we don't fully understand when we look from a distance, and one way to find out what's behind those patterns is to observe the behavior of particular groups of investors."

Saar spent a year as a visiting research economist for the New York Stock Exchange, which provided ample opportunity to observe players and trading mechanisms there. "It also impressed on me the importance of institutional arrangements and other constraints, and how they shape markets," he says. "When I teach, I stress the importance of institutional detail in addition to analytical finance, so students come out prepared to deal with the complexity of the world of finance."



Mark Zurack first came to the Johnson School as a student, acquiring an MBA in 1980. Then followed 18 years with Goldman Sachs, starting and running the Equity Derivatives Research Group in North America and Asia. When he retired in 2001, he turned to teaching, and is now a visiting lecturer in finance at the Johnson School.

"It seemed like a logical career progression: to go to school, work, develop a certain level of expertise and industry knowledge, then go back and teach people who want to do what you used to do," says Zurack.

His course, called Equity Derivatives and Related Products, focuses on how those products are structured, valued, and used by investors globally. Asked how his previous career influences his teaching, Zurack says emphatically, "It is my teaching. I basically have taken a section of the capital market that I interacted with for close to 20 years and turned it into a class. And I do it in a way that is analytical enough to have academic rigor but at the same time practical enough so that people who take the class can go into the industry knowing exactly the relevance of what I'm teaching."

Zurack also teaches at Columbia's business school, and flies into Ithaca once a week for his class. "No one will tell you commuting from New York is fun," he jokes, but "it's a lot easier than my old job. The Johnson School is helpful; I've had good TAs, and good faculty support. It's a disadvantage when they cancel my flight. But I enjoy teaching, and I like being part of the university. If I didn't, I wouldn't do it."

The Baron Professorship of Management

Rosalyn (Roz) Zalutsky Baron '53, vice president-investments at UBS Financial Services, Inc., was the second woman to register with the New York Stock Exchange. Her husband, **Philip Baron**, is a professor emeritus of business policy at Iona College. Endowing a chair at the Johnson School is a logical extension of their professional interests.

A phenomenally active student—she was a reporter for the *Cornell Daily Sun* and belonged to Alpha Epsilon Phi, among other things—Roz is still involved as a member of the Cornell Council, the Cornell Club-New York, and chair of her 45th Reunion. She is also past president of the Cornell Alumnae Association of New York City and the Hillel Alumnae Board. Both of the couple's sons are Cornell graduates: Barry and Stuart are Class of '78 and '82, respectively.

Roz's dedication to Cornell is based in part on the intellectual and social opportunities she found here, but also because she says her Cornell education "opened doors on Wall Street for me." Jack Dreyfus hired her right out of college. "Nobody else was hiring women on Wall Street then unless you wanted to be a secretary, but one of his partners went to Cornell, so he knew the value of a Cornell education."

The Dr. Philip and Rosalyn Baron Professorship of Management will focus on financial history, the history of financial markets, and business strategy. "It's important for Cornell to continue to provide a very high-quality graduate-level education, particularly in business," says Philip. "To be liberally educated, a person really should have some understanding of the role that financial institutions play in American life. It's important to strengthen Cornell's ability to provide such knowledge."

Giving Back to Community Through the Hunt Fellowship



When **Rodney P. Hunt** thinks of Cornell, he remembers trudging up the notorious Buffalo Street hill to campus. “I’d never been to a place so cold.”

Hunt returned to Cornell in October 2007 to speak at the annual Black Graduate Business Association Symposium. As a successful business owner and head of a foundation dedicated to improving the lives of disadvantaged children, he’d

put those cold uphill climbs into perspective. “I likened it to the struggles you go through and the things you later appreciate,” Hunt says, “and one of those things was the beautiful environment. And the climate. And the people at Cornell.”

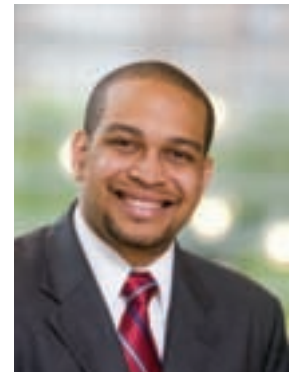

The students especially moved him. “I saw a lot of young minority men and women who, if given the opportunity, could go as far as me or even farther.” At the end of the symposium, Hunt announced that the Rodney P. Hunt Family Foundation would establish a fellowship for Johnson School students who have demonstrated success despite economic hardship.

The first Hunt Fellow is **Lawrence Watkins**, who was in the audience when the announcement was made. “I actually said to the person sitting next to me, ‘Wow, I wish I was coming to Cornell.’” At the time, Watkins was preparing to go to Duke University, which had offered him a generous financial aid package. “When I found out I received the Hunt Fellowship, it was a no-brainer to attend Cornell instead of Duke,” he says. “The Hunt Fellowship is what brought me here. Mr. Hunt is someone I aspire to be like. He’s someone I respect.”

“The mission of the Hunt Family Foundation is to develop the whole child—to feel we’re blessed, to give back to the community, and never forget where we came from,” says Hunt. “That announcement was based in a lot of faith and confidence in the university, the curriculum, and the students. I want them to recognize that they, too, are blessed, and make the most of it.”

Tanenbaum Scholarship Reflects Cornellians' Pride

The late Robert M. Tanenbaum '54, MBA '55, and his wife, **Carol Colby Tanenbaum**, were very aware of the enormous difference a scholarship can make to a student. "Without a scholarship, school would have been impossible for me, and more difficult for him," says Carol. The Robert M. and Carol Colby Tanenbaum Scholarship "was our way of offering similar opportunities to other students."

One recipient is **Candace Davies** '00, MBA '06, who has found in Tanenbaum a friend and mentor who shares her interests in travel, theater, and philanthropy. "Carol has been the perfect donor match for me," says Davies. "She is so well traveled and philanthropic, and I enjoy getting together with her."

Davies attributes her readiness to take up a challenging career to her undergraduate and graduate experiences at Cornell. She found a strong network of Cornellians at Goldman Sachs, where she now works as a private wealth advisor. And she is very grateful for the support she received as a student.

"I can directly relate my happiness today with where I am in my career to receiving the Tanenbaum Scholarship," Davies says. "Without it, I never would've had the opportunity to participate in the program like I did at the Johnson School and would not be where I am."

"Meeting Candace, and receiving letters from our Cornell scholarship students, is a very satisfying experience," Carol says. "It was always our hope that they would, in turn, contribute to their school. So far, Candace and the others have 'given back' far more than we ever expected."

Class of 2004 Gift Creates Scholarship

Class of 2004 co-vice presidents **Christian Rhodes** and David Titus polled their classmates before deciding what form their class gift would take. The class voted to create a scholarship that reflected the student population at the Johnson School, in all its diversity. “We’ve given the admissions office discretion to hand out the scholarship as they see fit to help build the class,” says Rhodes. “Our only requirement is that over time, the students awarded represent both domestic and international students.

“We didn’t want to restrict the scholarship to students from a particular region, job category, race, or gender,” he adds. “When the decision is made about who will receive the scholarship, we want to make sure we give the admissions office the opportunity to award it to a broad cross section of students.”

Rhodes, who works in supply-chain management for Deloitte Consulting, LLP, in Philadelphia, has benefited personally from his own experiences as part of a diverse mix of students. “My time at the Johnson School has broadened my thinking and given me confidence,” he says. “I think more globally now than ever before. I think this is a result of the great friends that I’ve met at the school during my two years.

“As a native of Central New York, I have always thought about attending Cornell,” Rhodes says. “Cornell and the Johnson School will always be a part of my life.”

Investing in the Very Best



From a 20-year stint with Procter and Gamble to Internet marketing, with terms as president of Dr. Pepper Co. and Fidelity Investments, as CEO of Schenley Industries, and managing partner of Host Communications in between, **Chuck Jarvie** '58, MBA '59, has enjoyed a successful and varied career. Now a partner in Beta Capital Group, LLC, a private equity firm in Dallas, Texas, Jarvie recalls his years at the then-new business school at Cornell.

"I was privileged to be in with some very bright students and really good professors," Jarvie says. "Hal Bierman was terrific. So were Gilmore

and Nielsen. Hal taught me that I should never go into accounting—for the good of the profession. But Rex Peterson was one of his best students, and I teamed up with Rex for many years." This typified Jarvie's experience at Cornell: "I learned how to approach problems and identify and work with good people. There's no substitute for good people."

Jarvie puts that belief into practice by designating his gifts to the Johnson School for activities that strengthen its chances of recruiting the best students.

"If you get the top people in, and you give them a good education, they're going to have the most success," he says, "and those alumni will contribute the most in terms of time and money. It's a circular process not always widely understood."

EMBA Class of '08 Gift Supports Annual Fund

The EMBA Class of '08 directed its gift to the Annual Fund because "the things the Annual Fund does are really the things that make the school work," says class president **Shaown Nandi** '97, MBA '08. Case in point: The school used money from the Annual Fund to put automated defibrillators around Sage Hall. When one of Nandi's classmates had a cardiac event in the atrium, a Johnson School staff member was able to use a nearby defibrillator to save his life.



The event was especially meaningful to the Class of '08, which Nandi calls "incredibly tight-knit. EMBA students take every class together; we room together when we're at IBM Palisades and the Statler so we really bonded socially. We just had a barbecue that people flew in and drove hours to attend.

Nandi, who graduated high school at 16, is unabashedly dedicated to his alma mater. "I grew up at Cornell," he says,

and he helped translate that love into activities for his EMBA class when they studied on campus, including walking tours and hockey games. It seems to have worked. “A lot of our class was very excited to stay connected with Cornell after they graduated,” says Nandi. “I still get questions like, ‘How do I keep my Cornell e-mail address?’ and ‘What’s up with the Cornell Club?’” He also attributes this to the special circumstances of the EMBA student: “We’re in the middle of our careers. We’re going to school while working full time. We can see the benefits of the program the next day at work.”

Gifts that Enhance Opportunities



When **Duncan D. Russell** '71, MBA '73, was asked to become national chair of the Johnson School's Annual Fund, he had just completed his assignment as reunion chair for the MBA Class of '73. “It was a heartwarming experience, reaching out to alums, some of whom I hadn't talked to in many years,” he says. “I had excellent support working with the alumni office. They provided historical data, assistance with mailings, alumni contacts, and they were eager

to try new things.” Buoyed by that success, Russell agreed to take on this new challenge. “I've had a few ideas for enhancing national fundraising, some garnered from the success of the Class of '73 campaign. So I said yes.”

As reunion chair, Russell made a significant gift to the Annual Fund and challenged his classmates to match it. The Annual Fund “gives the dean flexibility. It's an important

leg of the financial base that the school depends on,” says Russell. “To the extent that we can expand Annual Fund support, it will enhance opportunities at the Johnson School and better position the school to compete for top faculty and students nationally and globally.”

Russell, whose bachelor's degree is in mechanical engineering, calls his overall experience as a Cornell student “very formative. My undergraduate studies helped develop me from a technical and an analytical standpoint, and the business school provided me with a well-rounded degree in accounting, finance, and marketing. Cornell provided the foundation for my success in business. My interest now is in giving back to the school so that others can share an outstanding educational experience.”

Estate Planning: Investing in the endowment

Bell Fund Supports Dean's Initiatives



As chairman of a small family business, Bell-Memphis, Inc., **Roy E. Bell Jr.**, MBA '50, is well aware of how opportunities and challenges can arise that incur expenses outside an organization's budget. So, he established the Roy E. Bell Jr. Dean's Discretionary Fund to give the Johnson School dean the flexibility to support activities that will benefit the school. In this way, Bell is able to support the school's efforts to recruit the best faculty and students and fund research and programs that will enhance the quality of education there.

The Bell Fund is dedicated to the memory of Paul O'Leary, the founding dean of the Johnson School. "He was a longtime faculty member who had been interested in the idea of starting a graduate school in business for a number of years," says Bell, "With President [Edmund] Day's encouragement, O'Leary was able to put together this program and recruit an outstanding faculty from the beginning."

Bell is especially pleased with the instrument used to create the fund: a charitable gift annuity. "Another reason for doing the gift is the income for life for me and my wife, which is good as we live longer these days," says Bell. "The rate of return stacks up well with optional annuity investments. And because it's a charitable classification, there are significant deductions on your income tax. I felt it was an opportunity not only to do something for the Johnson School, but for my wife and myself and our financial planning."

An "Elegant Solution" to Giving

The IRS recently granted Cornell University permission to invest charitable remainder trusts in its endowment, currently valued at over \$5.3 billion. **Jack Neafsey** '62, MBA '63, was among the first alumni to take advantage of this new option, which he calls "a very elegant solution" to the question of how to give to the university.



"There are many of us who worked for several different companies and ended our careers in a very satisfactory position, but perhaps did not have a pension," Neafsey explains. "The endowment strategy is extraordinarily helpful in that it ensures that there will be a rather robust lifetime income, not just for me but for my wife, and she doesn't have

to worry about how it's going to be invested or who's going to do it. She'll receive a stream of funds coming from Cornell that she can depend on."

In addition, "it's a chance to avail myself of investment returns that as an individual investor I don't have access to—the hedge fund world, the real estate world," says Neafsey, who is president of JN Associates, an investment consulting firm in Norwalk, Conn. "It's always been my intention that

my money would go to Cornell at the end of the day. This is a nice interim step.”

Neafsey has been generous with time as well as gifts, serving on the Board of Trustees and the Johnson School’s advisory council. An engineering student as an undergraduate, he has directed that his latest gift be used to create closer connections between the College of Engineering and the Johnson School. “Engineering can benefit from the business acumen that resides at the Johnson School,” he says, “and the Johnson School can benefit from some of the quantitative technologies that reside at the engineering school.”

Fidelity Forms Close Ties Through Stock Pitch Competition



Initiated by the Parker Center for Investment Research at the Johnson School, the annual Stock Pitch Competition pits teams of MBA students from ten elite business schools against each other in a contest to prepare, present, and defend buy, hold, and sell recommendations before a panel of investment industry experts. Contestants get a chance to shine before prospective employers, since participating

firms usually send their recruiters along to shop for top talent.

The lead sponsor in 2007 and again in 2008 is Fidelity Investments. The company also sends Vice President and Portfolio Manager **Larry Rakers**, who has judged the competition for four years and considers it an excellent fit for Fidelity.

“The Stock Pitch Competition and the core of the Fidelity research process are very similar,” says Rakers. In addition, “lots of times I hear about stocks and stories I didn’t know about, so I learn something.”

Sponsoring the contest also gives Fidelity access to the kind of students it is interested in. “To enter the competition, to travel to Cornell to participate, you have already selected yourself as someone who wants to get into the business and really likes stock,” Rakers says.

It also helps Fidelity form a closer relationship with the Johnson School, something Rakers says the company is eager to do. “The quality of students that attend Cornell; the Parker Center, a unique asset that a lot of schools don’t have; the portfolio class; the quality of the education you get at Cornell; all those things attract us to the Johnson School. I’ve been going there for four years, and it seems like the school is getting better and better.”

Johnson & Johnson Supports Brand Immersion Learning

Johnson & Johnson, the pharmaceutical, medical devices, and consumer packaged-goods manufacturer, is an avid recruiter of Johnson School graduates. It is also one of the school’s valued corporate partners, offering students “day-in-the-life” experiential learning opportunities. Through its consumer products division, it also provides a perfect laboratory for those in the brand management immersion program.

Charles Colagiuri ’92, MBA ’02, has been working at Johnson & Johnson since graduation and is currently director of global processes. “Johnson & Johnson has been a strong supporter of the Johnson School for quite some time,” he says, and attributes this to the “tremendous cultural fit” between the school and the corporation.

“The Johnson & Johnson credo—putting customers and patients first, shareholders last—and our tagline, ‘small-company environment, big-company impact,’ very much mirrors the Johnson School,” says Colagiuri.

The corporation uses an entrepreneurial model, in which each of the more than 200 subsidiary companies is run as a separate business. “It is not a top-down organization. You’re held accountable for your local business,” he explains. “I think that’s what Johnson School students find appealing about it—they get to create something and be recognized for it.”

Johnson & Johnson is partial to Cornell MBAs because “we’re interested in people who are going to drive their own careers, build their own business, and demonstrate strong leadership skills,” says Colagiuri. “Technical skills are easier to find. It’s the intangible skills that we are really looking for.”

Developing Leadership Through the Park Fellowship

Park Fellow **Sarah Scudder**, MBA '09, had spent five years in strategy consulting for public sector and nonprofit clients when she chose to move into the commercial sector.

“An MBA would accelerate my career in this direction, and I knew I wanted a smaller school—a place where I could know the faculty and my classmates—yet have access to the resources of a major research university,” Scudder explains. “The Johnson School has given me that.”

She found the quantitative background she needed in the Managerial Finance Immersion and a chance to see how much she liked internal corporate consulting through a summer internship with the 3M Company. She worked on three distinct projects in marketing, finance, and broad strategic development.

The Park Fellowship offered even more. “To go beyond the traditional MBA courses and have a deliberate portion of my time dedicated to leadership development—especially to understanding under what circumstances I perform best—is invaluable,” Scudder says.

Scudder was chosen by the faculty as a teaching assistant in two core courses—one in finance and the other in managing and leading organizations—because they saw her desire, along with her ability to enhance the first-year students’ experience. She’s also assumed leadership roles in the Student Council, Net Impact, and Career Action Group.

For her Park Fellowship service project, Scudder is collaborating with the Offices of Admissions and Alumni Affairs to create the Johnson School Personalized Admission Links, or JSPALS.

“JSPALS will give newly accepted students an instant Cornell network of three to four people—other students and alumni who will reach out to them, welcome them into the Johnson community,” Scudder explains. “This program will keep giving back to the Johnson School in the future.”

Park Fellow Advances His Knowledge in New Fields

As an executive officer with the 1st Battalion 33rd Field Artillery in Bayji, Iraq, **Kevin Johnson**, MBA '09, spent a year watching oil fires.

“It got me thinking about the impact of the oil industry,” says Johnson, who decided that after separating from the military—his last assignment was as a diversity admissions officer for the United States Military Academy at West Point—he would pursue a career in the renewable energy sector.

He’s found the Johnson School the ideal place for this transition. As a Park Fellow, he can pursue projects that advance his knowledge of his newly chosen field, while receiving leadership training that enhances the skills he already has in managing people.

“Surrounded by a cohort of 25 amazing first-year students who have done things all over the world allows an opportunity for candid feedback unlike any I could receive in the military with its rigid rank structure,” Johnson explains. “It’s very powerful; I learned more about myself than I ever thought I could coming in.”

After a semester in the Sustainable Global Enterprise Immersion, Johnson interned with Acciona Energy, a Spanish-owned renewable-energy firm specializing in wind power and concentrated solar power. A member of the Energy Club, Johnson’s Park Fellowship service project is to co-chair the Net Impact Conference, which will bring 1,800 MBA students from around the country to campus in fall 2009 for a weekend of speakers, panels, and a job fair on sustainable business practices.

“As students we’re showing that there are great jobs outside the norm—jobs critical for the nation’s future,” Johnson says.



Teaching Awards

Russell Distinguished Teaching Award

Mark W. Nelson, Eleanora and George Landew Professor of Management, professor of accounting, and associate dean for academic affairs, was presented with the 2008 Stephen Russell Distinguished Teaching Award at Reunion 2008 by the MBA Class of 2003. Each year, the fifth-year reunion class selects the recipients of the Russell Distinguished

Teaching Award, endowed by Stephen Russell, MBA '61.



Nelson's research examines psychological and economic factors that influence how people interpret and apply accounting, auditing, and tax regulations and trade in financial markets. Some recent studies have examined the methods by which firms manage their earnings and

the effectiveness of the audit function in preventing earnings management. Other recent studies examine how investors' psychological biases lead to predictable security mispricing. His work has been widely published in many scholarly journals, including *Accounting Review*, *Academy of Management Review*, and the *Journal of Behavioral Decision Making*, and has also been widely reported in the business press. He serves on the Financial Accounting Standards Advisory Council, is an editor of *Accounting Review*, and is a member of the editorial boards of *Accounting Horizons*, *Auditing: A Journal of Practice and Theory*, and *Accounting, Organizations and Society*.

Nelson has earned multiple honors for his teaching, research, and contributions to the accounting discipline. These include two citations by *BusinessWeek* as an outstanding faculty member, and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants/American Accounting Association Notable Contribution to Accounting Literature Award in 2004. Nelson was selected twice to receive the Apple Award for Teaching Excellence, in 1994 and 2004.

Apple Award for Teaching Excellence

Young-Hoon Park, assistant professor of marketing, was selected by the Class of 2008 as this year's recipient of the

Apple Award for Teaching Excellence, established by the Class of 1992 as part of their class gift.



Park's research focuses on analyzing behavioral data to understand and forecast customer shopping and purchasing activities. His other major research interests include customer relationship management and developing new models of marketing research. His

work has been published in leading marketing journals, including the *Journal of Marketing Research*, *Management Science*, and *Marketing Science*. The Marketing Science Institute identified him as one of the young scholars most likely to influence marketing theory and practice. In 2008, he was a finalist for the John D.C. Little best marketing paper award given out by the Institute for Operations Research and the Management Sciences, for a paper he published in *Marketing Science*.

Park received the Johnson School's Exceptional Research Award in 2004-05 and 2005-06 and has been recognized for exceptional teaching on multiple occasions since joining the Johnson School in 2001. He previously taught at the Wharton School of Business, University of Pennsylvania, where he received the Wharton Advisory Board Outstanding Teaching Award and the Graduate Student Association Council Teaching Award.

Executive MBA Globe Award for Teaching Excellence

Thomas D. Fields, visiting lecturer, was honored as this year's recipient of the EMBA Globe Award for teaching excellence. Fields is a lecturer in accounting at the Olin



School of Business at Washington University. Before returning to graduate school, he worked as a CPA for Price Waterhouse in St. Louis, performing audit services for a range of clients including Anheuser Busch, Union Electric (now Ameren Corporation), SSM Health Care, and a number of small manufacturers and nonprofit organizations. Field's research

interests involve the role of accounting information in contracting, particularly in the setting of accounting-based covenants in debt contracts. His work has been published in the *Journal of Accounting & Economics*, *Review of Accounting Studies*, and the *Journal of Accounting, Auditing & Finance*. He has taught at the Kellogg School of Management (Northwestern University), where he earned his master's and PhD, and at Harvard Business School.

Cornell-Queen's Executive MBA Star Award

Marc L. Busch, professor of economics, was awarded the Cornell-Queen's Executive MBA Star Award for outstanding teaching. Busch, who teaches international business in the CQEMBA program, is the Karl F. Landegger Professor of



International Business Diplomacy at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service, and associate professor in Georgetown's Department of Government. His research and teaching focus on international trade policy and law. He is currently engaged in research on the economic geography of European trade policy and the "early settlement" of disputes under the GATT/WTO. He is the author of

the book *Trade Warriors*. Busch was previously an associate professor at the Queen's School of Business and, prior to that, an associate professor of government and social studies at Harvard University and director of graduate student programs at Harvard's Weatherhead Center for International Affairs. He has been awarded research grants from the National Science Foundation, the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, Harvard, the John M. Olin Foundation, the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, the Center for Social Sciences at Columbia, and the Institute for the Study of World Politics, among others. He is co-editor of the journal *Economics & Politics*.



Johnson School Highlights 2007–2008

- Hired seven new full-time faculty members.
- Added 15 new courses to the curriculum.
- Celebrated several tenth-anniversary milestones: the Johnson School's move into the newly reconstructed Sage Hall, the founding of the Parker Center for Investment Research and the Cayuga Fund, and the Roy H. Park Leadership Fellows Program.
- Launched Sage Socials in fall 2007, social hours held on Thursdays from 4:15 to 5:45 p.m., designed to increase opportunities for informal socializing among staff, faculty, and students.
- Founded the Alternative Investments Club, aimed at connecting the Johnson School community with practitioners in private equity. Gaining 200 members in its first few months, the club is the first to bring together students from all four of Cornell's MBA programs, alumni, and faculty.

The fellowships, which include a stipend, require recipients to work with a faculty or senior staff member on a project of mutual academic or professional interest.

- Introduced the Parker Series, alumni networking events designed to educate, stimulate, and broaden perspectives on timely business issues. Sponsored by Jeffrey P. Parker '65, MEng '66, MBA '70, managing director of the Parker Family Limited Partnership, the series bring together panels of authoritative business experts at events around the world.
- Launched a capstone event for second-year MBA students, the Personal Success Program, designed to give students an opportunity to network with Advisory Council members and to reflect on and prepare for their careers as leaders.
- A team of Johnson School students took first place and a \$20,000 prize at the National Human Capital Case Competition, the nation's first-ever MBA-level competition focusing on human capital challenges, held October 19–20 at Vanderbilt's Owen Graduate School of Management in Nashville.
- The student-run Cayuga MBA Fund, LLC, a market-neutral equity hedge fund, delivered a return of 5.95 percent in 2007, compared to 3.11 percent for the Hedge Fund Research Equity Market Neutral index and 3.21 percent for the Hedge Fund Research Equity Hedge index.



As many as 25 students receive a full-tuition grant and stipend from the Roy H. Park Leadership Fellows Program each year. The program serves to attract the highest-caliber students to the Johnson School, reward outstanding past performance, and develop demonstrated leadership potential.

- The Johnson School was recognized as a CFA Program Partner by the Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) Institute. The CFA program sets a standard for developing the skills, standards, competence, and integrity of financial analysts, portfolio managers, investment advisers, and other investment professionals worldwide.
- The Cornell-Queen's Executive MBA program received approval to expand into Texas and Georgia, and has been recruiting in Atlanta, Dallas, and Houston for the Class of 2010.
- The Johnson School was selected to host the Net Impact International Conference, to be held on Cornell's campus in fall 2009. The conference will bring together approximately 2,000 students, professionals, and thought leaders from around the world to discuss the latest ideas and opportunities in business and sustainability.

Faculty Highlights

- Joe Thomas, the Nicholas H. Noyes Professor of Manufacturing and professor of operations management, was named Ann and Elmer Lindseth Dean of the Johnson School on March 27, 2008, having served with great success as interim dean since June 2007.
- Mark Nelson, Eleanora and George Landew Professor of Management and professor of accounting, was named the Johnson School's associate dean for Academic Affairs, a position previously held by Johnson School Dean Joe Thomas.
- Dana Radcliffe was appointed Day Family Senior Lecturer in Business Ethics, a position created in September 2007 by the establishment of the Day Family Senior Lecturer in Business Ethics Discretionary Fund, an endowed fund that supports business ethics programs at the Johnson School and at Cornell Law School. The fund is made possible by the generous donation of the Dr. Harry M. Day Charitable Foundation. Radcliffe has been teaching classes in business ethics, corporate responsibility, and leadership at the Johnson School since 2000 and has been responsible for leading the school's ethics-related events and initiatives.
- Maureen O'Hara, Robert W. Purcell Professor of Management and professor of finance, was appointed chairman of the board at Investment Technology Group, Inc., a specialized agency brokerage and technology firm that partners with clients globally to provide innovative solutions spanning the entire investment process. O'Hara has been a director at Investment Technology Group since January 2003 and lead director since January 2005.
- Elizabeth Mannix, Ann Whitney Olin Professor of Management, was named recipient of the 2007-08 Faculty Research Award. Mannix also serves as the Robert S. Harrison Director of Cornell's Institute for the Social Sciences and vice provost for equity and inclusion. In her research, Mannix analyzes topics such as diversity in organizations and teams, power and alliances, negotiation and conflict, and organizational change and renewal.
- Yaniv Grinstein, assistant professor of finance, was awarded the Best Paper Prize for the most significant paper published in the *Journal of Financial Intermediation* in 2006 for his paper, "The Disciplinary Role of Debt and Equity Contracts: Theory and Tests."
- Sachin Gupta, Henrietta Johnson Louis Professor of Management and professor of marketing, received the 2008 O'Dell Award from the *Journal of Marketing Research* for his paper, "Is 75 percent of the Sales Promotion Bump Due to Brand Switching? No, Only 33 percent Is," co-authored by Harald J. van Heerde and Dick R. Wittink. Gupta also won best paper for a *Cornell Hospitality Quarterly* article, "Guest Satisfaction and Restaurant Performance," co-authored by Edward McLaughlin and Miguel Gomez.
- Michael Waldman, the Charles H. Dyson Professor of Management and professor of economics, received the Robert F. Lanzillotti Prize for Best Paper in *Antitrust Economics* for, "Why Tie a Product Consumers do not Use?"



Message from the Annual Fund Chair

As I complete my second year as national chair of the Johnson School's Annual Fund, I am very pleased to report that, due to the support of 2,824 Johnson School alumni donors, along with students, corporations, foundations, and friends, the Johnson School raised \$12,815,395 in fiscal year 2008. Of this total, giving to the Annual Fund equaled \$2,303,398, a new record for unrestricted gifts to the school for the third year in a row. This amount represents a 26 percent increase in Annual Fund giving over fiscal-year 2007.

There are several facets to this kind of success, and I would like to highlight just a few that speak volumes about the kind of dedication our alumni and students display to the Johnson School:

- The Dean's Leadership Committee, consisting of 24 alumni, raised \$154,000 from 98 completed assignments. The dean relies on this group of dedicated volunteers to ask fellow alumni for gifts of \$5,000 and above.
- Alumni celebrating their milestone reunions contributed \$1,297,097; \$146,306 more than last year's reunion total. Fifty enthusiastic and energetic volunteers assisted with the reunion campaigns, and we are grateful for the time and personal resources they dedicated to this effort.
- The full-time MBA class had a very successful class gift campaign, raising \$62,435 in gifts. Lead by Adrienne Martinez, MBA '08, a great group of second-year MBA volunteers successfully encouraged 83 percent of their classmates to give a gift to the Johnson School in honor of their graduation.
- The part-time EMBA class had remarkable success in participation to their class gift: a full 100 percent of the class made gifts totaling \$64,694 in unrestricted funds. This impressive effort was lead by Shaown Nandi, MBA '08.
- The Cornell-Queen's graduating class gave an unrestricted gift of \$14,863 from 68 percent of the class in honor of their graduation. My special thanks to Todd Mazurek and Jim McAllister, MBA '08, for rallying the support of their classmates.

The Johnson School is a dynamic center for business education. I believe the results detailed here are a testament to our school's stature and to your commitment to strengthening it. I look forward to working with our current and newest volunteers, and I hope our caring and generous supporters will join me in continuing to demonstrate our loyalty and commitment to the Johnson School.

Year in Review 2007–2008

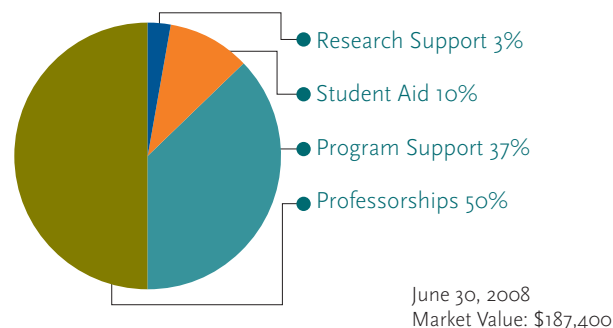
This section provides a brief financial overview of the Johnson School as of June 30, 2008. It also includes a summary of employment results for the Class of 2008, an overview of prospective student recruiting for the fall, and a summary of highlights and noteworthy accomplishments.

The Johnson School's operating revenues exceeded operating expenses again in 2008; revenues increased just over 11 percent from 2006–07 while expense growth was held to just under 6 percent. Our Executive MBA and Cornell-Queen's MBA programs continue to provide over 20 percent of our operating revenue; these programs comprise over 30 percent of our total revenue from degree program tuition and fees.

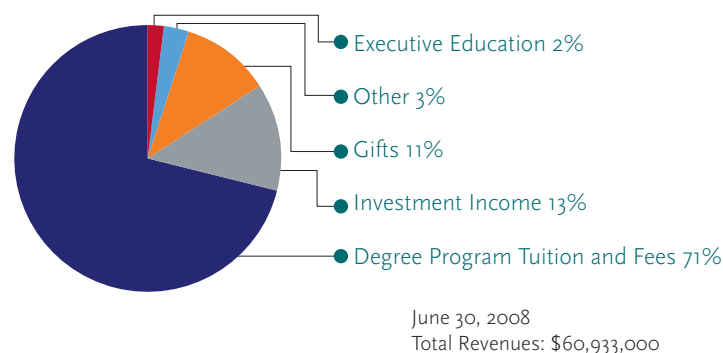
As we continued our efforts in support of our \$100 million goal for *Far Above...The Campaign for Cornell*, we saw a significant increase in the support and generosity of our alumni, friends, corporations, and foundations. Gifts to the Johnson School from generous alumni, friends, corporations, and foundations accounted for 11 percent of our revenue in 2008. We also continue to rely substantially on the generosity of past donors who, in adding to our endowment funding, helped provide 13 percent of our revenue last year in the form of investment income.

Our endowment market value increased by \$4.5 million during 2007–08, bringing our endowment to just over \$187 million. Continuing growth in our endowment comes from investment performance and gifts from donors. This year, donors created several new endowments for student scholarships and support of school programs, including the Business of Science and Technology Initiative.

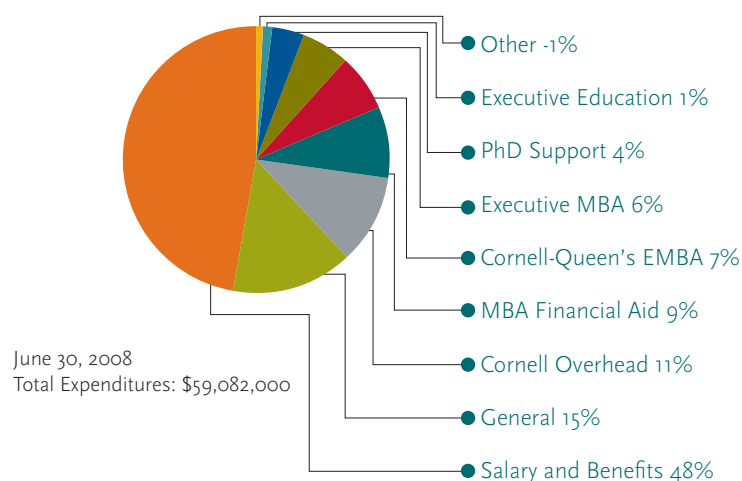
Endowment Market Value by Designation



2007–2008 Actual Revenues

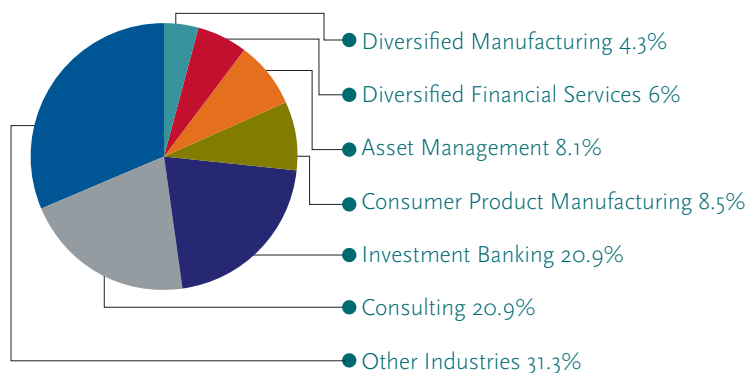


2007–2008 Actual Expenditures

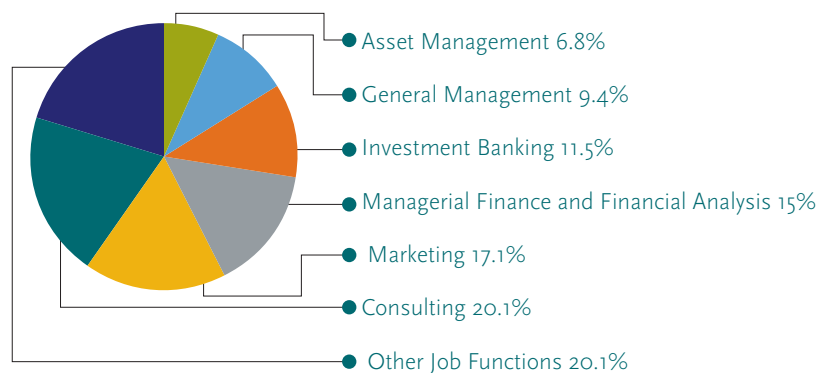


Class of 2008 Employment Stats

Jobs Accepted by Function



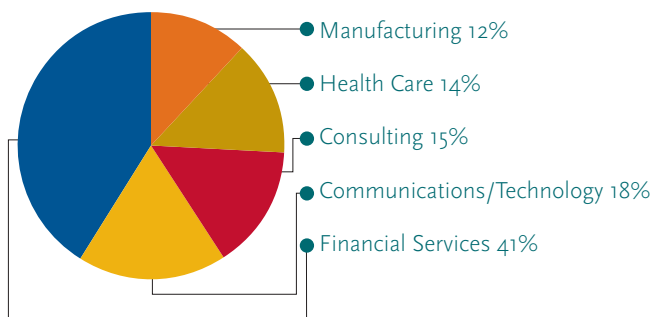

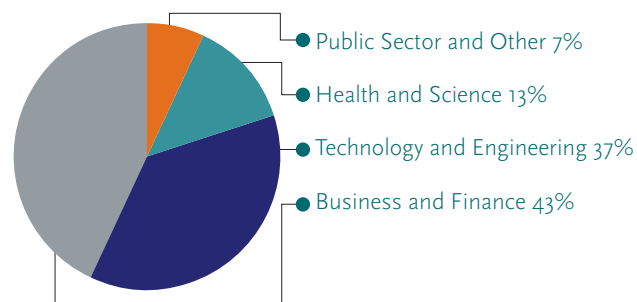
